## Forget the winter weather and remember the sunny days



WE thought you would like to see how Beryl and Mr Amber, two of the many feral cats who roam freely around our sanctuary, spent the sunny days of summer. Seen here relaxed and snoozing on a lawnmower, they enjoy a safe, healthy and well fed life.

We have a large number of feral cats who are all vaccinated, neutered and microchipped. It can certainly be fun trying to coax them into a cat basket when they need to visit the vets for treatment.

Our volunteers go to great lengths at this time of the year to ensure that the needs of all the outdoor animals in our care - feral cats, ponies, goats, sheep and birds - are met. They have to be fed, watered and sheltered in all weathers.

Deliveries of feed stuff, hay and straw can be disrupted in bad weather. Prices of the goods often increase out of all proportion. Nevertheless, our volunteers battle through all the good and bad days to ensure the best care for the animals.



#### **MEWS in BRIEF**



**NEWSPAPER CHANGE** Our search for new homes for unwanted animals is never ending.

To find new adopters we use many different avenues including photos and articles in local newspapers, our website, Facebook and posters.

One of the most successful ways for over eight years was Help A Pet, a cost-free weekly appeal in the Kentish Times (KT) newspapers. This resulted in

many hundreds of KT readers adopting Anim-Mates animals.

This summer the KT series underwent a complete redesign and became more of a magazine than a newspaper. This resulted in many of its regular features, including Help A Pet, not having a place in the new publication. This resulted in a dramatic drop in the number of animals being offered new homes.

We are relieved to report that two papers, the Medway Messenger Monday edition serving the Medway area and the News Shopper which covers south-east London, have since come to our rescue by featuring our weekly articles in their publications.



Despite his illnesses, Polo was always a very happy, carefree dog who enjoyed the company of the other dogs in Teresa's care. Polo also loved human beings. And we all adored him, too.

## Jocelyn's tail amputated after a door was slammed on it

TWO tiny kittens have been nursed through separate traumas they experienced when just a few weeks old.

Jocelyn was originally bought for a child as a playmate. Within days the child slammed a door on the kitten's tail and it had to be amputated.

Subsequently the kitten was let out in the garden whilst still very tiny and was attacked and seriously injured by an older cat.

Annabelle was about six weeks when she was picked up straying on a busy road where she crying for her mother.

As they have become such firm friends while in



our care Jocelyn and Annabelle, who are now about five months old, will be rehomed together to a home without young children.

Teresa says: "As young children cannot always be expected to treat delicate kittens with the utmost of care, we usually play safe and insist that a new home should be child free. Better that than have a regrettable accident occur."
